

....A little note on bringing your dog to stay with us

As dog owners ourselves we welcome well behaved, house trained and quiet dogs in our Coach House only as it has direct access to outside and to the gardens. We believe that Pembrokeshire beaches are best explored in the company of your faithful friend.

We do however politely request that a few housekeeping points are considered before bringing your dog with you so we can ensure you're happy during your stay with us.

We do ask that dogs are NEVER left alone in the rooms unless by prior arrangement. Usually when guests dine with us we ask that they leave their dogs in the car or in a crate in your room.

Dogs are not permitted on the furniture or the beds and we ask that owners bring all their dogs bedding with them.

We also ask that dogs are NOT washed off in baths or showers. We ask that guests do not use the towels provided in the bathrooms to dry off a dog so please ask and we will happily give you some towels especially for this. There is an outside tap next to the boiler room for washing off. It's located on the wall just before the ground floor Coach house rooms.

Please ensure that they are dry and clean before returning to your room. There is a charge of £10.00 per dog per night (maximum of 1 medium sized dog or 2 very small dogs).

Dogs are allowed in the Bar, Drawing room and Sun room but not permitted in the Dining room. They must be quiet and calm or you may be asked to take them outside. In the gardens we ask that you clear up after your dog. There is a bin under the staircase by the Coach House

If we discover that dogs have been permitted on the beds or the furniture or have made a mess in the room then we will very reluctantly charge an additional fee of £100.00 to your card to cover the cost of a deep cleaning of the room for future non dog owning guests. Dog owners accept responsibility for any damage to property or persons injured by their dogs.

Guide dogs are welcome and allowed in all areas of the hotel including the Restaurant.
